Instructions for submitting your cases for the M.Orth Cases Prize

- 1. You are required to submit two cases presented in the Membership in Orthodontics examination.
- 2. Cases will be judged on the difficulty of the case, the clinical management, and the finish achieved. The variety of malocclusion and treatment approach shown in the two cases will also be taken into consideration.
- 3. Case records should show the names or initials of the patient but not your name. Ensure the records are accompanied by your entry number shown on your letter.
- 4. Cases can be presented in either of the standard formats of the two Examinations.
- 5. Film radiographs are not required provided that high quality scanned images are available.
- 6. Case records should be delivered to BOS Offices in London by 12noon on Friday 18th September 2016 for judging. Entries received after this will not be able to be judged for the Prize, but will be displayed at BOC.
- 7. Applicants are advised to ensure that they retain duplicate case records, as the security of submitted records cannot be guaranteed and you should ensure that these are securely packaged to avoid damage in transit. The British Orthodontic Society accepts no responsibility for damage to the models and/or case folders submitted.
- 8. Applicants must take responsibility for collection of their submission from the clinical cases display area at the close of the meeting.
- 9. Presenters may not advertise any orthodontic appliances or treatment techniques.
